IT WAS JANUSZ WHO EXECUTED THE TERRORIST LEADER
CHRIS HANI



Janusz Jacob Walus

Janusz Walus was born in Poland in 1953, the son of a businessman who was constantly harrassed by the communist authorities. His father's businesses were closed down at least eight times by the authorities, and each time his father reopened his business in a different town. Janus'z family roots are from the eastern frontier of Poland (now Belorusse/Ukraine) and the horrors of the Bolshevik revolution remained alive in the family.

Walus grew up with a fear and hatred of communism, particularly because of its complete suffocation of religion. At the end of 1981 he immigrated to South Africa, believing that this country would be one of the last bastions of anti-communism, particularly because of the religious heritage of the Afrikaner people. He thus watched with despair the gradual sell-out to communist revolutionary forces, warning many but heard by only a few.

In 1985 he joined the Conservative Party of South Africa and canvassed in elections both in the Orange Free State and the West Rand. During that time he met Clive Derby-Lewis and they became fast friends.

In 1993 he was convicted for the assassination of SA Communist Party chief and MK commissaar Chris Hani and was sentenced to death. His sentence has been commuted to Life Imprisonment.

Of course, this assassination, a planned operation where no civilians were threatened or injured, has to be placed into context of the times.

Here is what The ANC (via their terrorist wing, Mkhonto We Sizwe) was up to, while they were not blowing up women and children with landmines or mowing them down with rifles.

This time it was another car bomb.
